

ORGANISATIONAL UPDATE

At the end of 2024 we are reflecting on the successes of the year. We revisited and revamped our first ever fully funded project "Home: A Project for New Writers" with part two in the series "Louder"; presented our fourth Framework Festival; submitted a Multi-Year Funding Bid; ran the Framework Fringe Takeover and the Scottish Emerging Theatre Awards; and recruited a new core team member in the brilliant Nay Dhanak!

Alongside this we also received many funding rejections, dreamed up a number of projects that are yet to see the light of day and are still living in uncertainty for that Multi-Year Funding in bid.

What has kept us going over 2024 is the sheer demand for support from emerging artists. We have received over 400 applications, as well as over 100 nominations for the Scottish Emerging Theatre Awards. The talent, the ambition and the kindness is permanent and enduring - and we are hopeful for more funding in 2025 to be able to support more artists.

We are delighted to be ending the year on a high, having just secured funding for our next project. More to come on that in January, and keep your fingers crossed for Multi-Year Funding to come our way!

2024 PROJECTS: LOUDER: A PROJECT FOR NEW WRITERS

Funded by the National Lottery via Creative Scotland In association Vanishing Point, Stellar Quines and the Royal Lyceum Theatre. Supported by the Traverse Theatre.

Artists: 19 Audience: 200

Louder was version 2 of our first ever funded project (Home: A Project for New Writers, 2021). Designed to challenge gender inequity in the sector, Louder specifically supported writers and directors of marginalised genders to create and present four 15-minute plays.

The writers were offered dramaturgical support and mentorship from Jackie Crichton (Royal Lyceum Theatre), and the directors received mentorship from Caitlin Skinner (Stellar Quines).

We commissioned four new short plays, which were then rehearsed at Vanishing Points studio for one day each - before being presented in Traverse 1 on the the 3rd May 2024.

The 4th Annual Framework Festival returned for another year! This year we delivered 6 BSL Interpreted online workshops led by Sara Shaarawi, Wonder Fools, Louise Gregory, Amie Burns Walker, Isla Cowan and Creative Scotland.

We also delivered our in-person event at the Traverse Theatre, featuring:

- A panel of industry professionals: Laila Noble (Play, Pie & a Pint), Jemima Levick (Tron Theatre) and Matthew Lenton (Vanishing Point)
- 4 workshops delivered by Andy McGregor (Sleeping Warrior), Michelle McKay (Genesis), Infinity Artist Management and Julia Taudevin (Disaster Plan).
- A scratch night featuring work from Jess Ferrier and Lois Hunt, performed by Hannah Yahya Hassan, Ellie Moran and Theo Seddon.

The festival is such a special event in the Framework calendar, and after a lack of Creative Scotland investment in 2023 it was particularly meaningful to receive this in 2024. Here's to the 5th in 2025!


SCOTTISH EMERGING THEATRE AWARDS

This year has seen the demand for our work increasing exponentially, with over 19 applications per available role. We also tipped over the 1000 applications received mark, with 1315 applications for 98 roles since Framework began doing artist development in 2020.

The sheer number of applicants, and the quality of them, evidence the need for our work alone. We hope with the investment of Multi-Year Funding - organisations across Scotland can deliver more artist development opportunities in 2025 and beyond.
